In order to achieve a flawless complexion and look fabulous for this special occasion, Victoria Lees, a fully trained beautician who represents celebrity make-up artist Daniel Sandler and his award winning range of cosmetics in Northallerton and North Yorkshire, recommends following these simple steps:

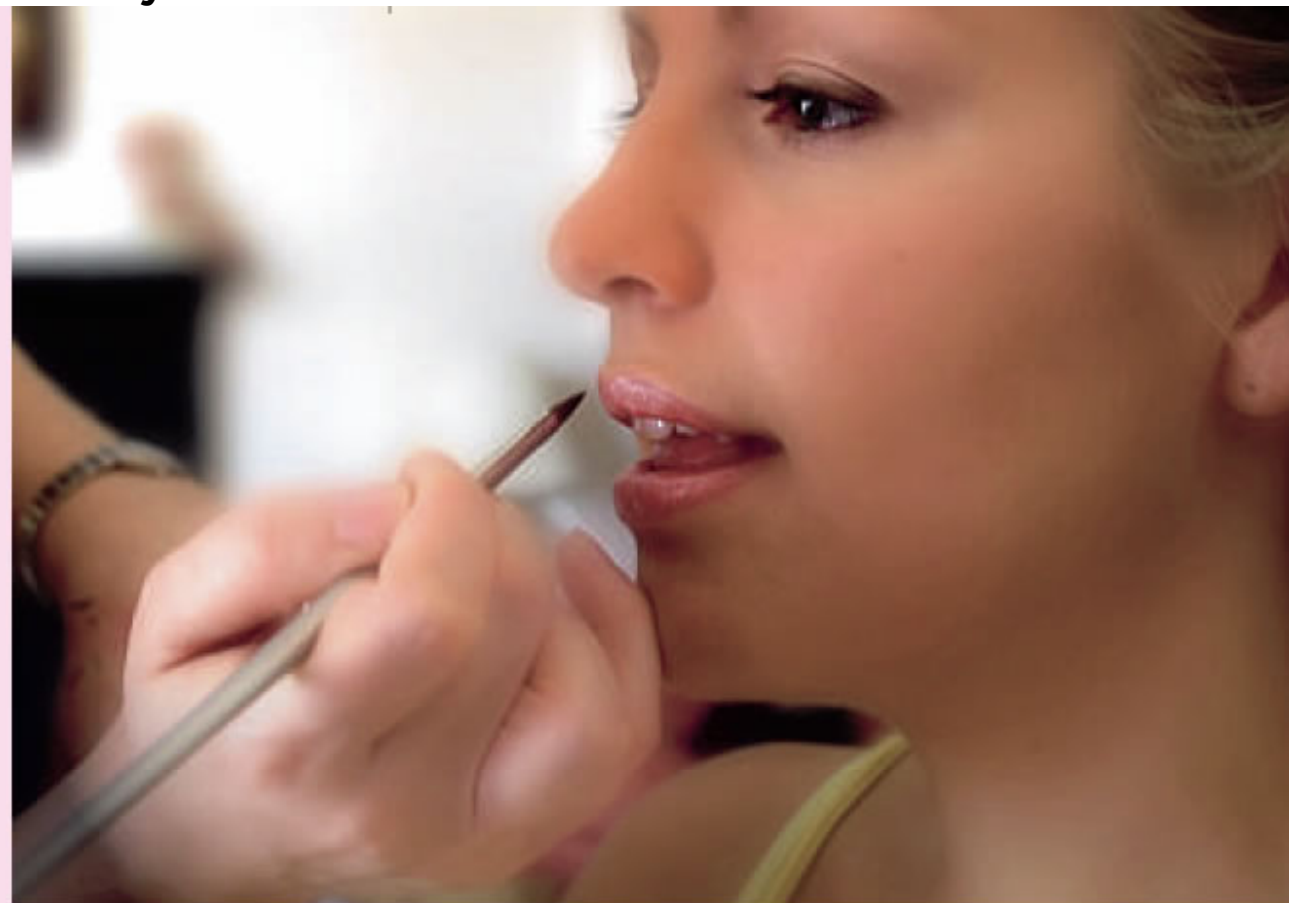
Start with a good skincare routine. Cleanse, tone and moisturise.

The first step to flawless, long lasting makeup is primer, preferably a silicone-based, oil-free product. Try the Daniel Sandler Retexturizing Primer (£13.50). This will fill in fine lines and pores and create a great base for your foundation.

Apply a foundation that matches your skin tone. If you want to add extra warmth, sweep bronzer where you would naturally catch the sun.

Concealer is great to get rid of any unwanted shadows that still persist after the foundation.

To set the foundation and concealer in place, you need to use powder. Make sure it does not alter the colour of the foundation. Both foundation and powder should be the same colour. Try the Daniel Sandler On The Loose Translucent Powders (£14.50). If



you want a semi-matte, natural finish, apply the powder with a brush. For a more matte, sophisticated look, use a powder puff. Apply blusher to the apples of your cheeks, blending upwards.

Use a light eye shadow all over the eyelid to open up the eye. Then apply the colour of your choice from the upper lash line to the crease of the eye. Blending is the key to good make up. Make sure you don't leave any harsh lines.

A darker shade could be worn along the upper lash line, as close to the lashes as possible. For more dramatic eyes, apply a dark eye pencil in the inner rim of the eye.

Follow with two generous coats of black mascara. Try the Daniel Sandler Jet Mascara (£10), it glides onto the lashes and remains glossy all day long.

Whether you prefer lipstick or gloss, use a lip liner similar to the colour of your choice and blend using a cotton bud. This will

prevent the lipstick/gloss from bleeding. When applying lipstick, blot with a tissue and reapply to get a more lasting effect.

For the big day, it's probably best to hire a professional make-up artist to make sure you are at your most beautiful. It will also give you time to sit back and relax.

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
